-Farmacy Revolution Chamber Members, Jennifer & Gregg Lister (in newly renovated old gas station space at the corner of Main & Holland) very recently added lighting to their entire storefront roofline

using someone they said they were very pleased with. They had good things to say about the job he did, professionalism and quality of work and said they would recommend him to quote the project.

I reached out to the person they used about potentially measuring and quoting the project and he is very interested in speaking with you. I mentioned what you'd asked about LED lighting and he said he could quote that, as well. I told him I'd be sharing contact info with you for the EDC to further explain the potential project & take it from there. He looks forward to hearing from you.

Upon receipt of material and lights, City of Bellville will install and maintain.

Sportsplex with Covered Rodeo Arena

City Administrator will be exploring the possibility of funding this project thru the Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife grant program. Tony Krueger will be the BEDC representative along with the BEDC Executive Director. Tony Krueger stated the covered rodeo arena should be totally enclosed with climate control. In addition, Tony Krueger preferred a RV Park over a Hotel.

146 Acres (Old Landfill) owned by the City of Bellville. Talking with Grantworks (Gary Smith and Cody Russell) about grant funding for the following project:

Multi-sport (Little League Baseball, kids and high school softball, flag football, kickball, soccer, etc.) complex facility

Covered Rodeo Arena

Texas Parks & Wildlife Grants are 50/50 Match (Dollar for Dollar)

Need Comprehensive Plan, Site Design, community needs, online survey with Application along with goals and objectives

Conservation (Walking Trials, butterfly gardens, etc) & Sustainability (Reuse Land, Irrigation, Lighting (LED), etc.)

Grant Works assesses \$5,000 for application fee. Application Deadline August 1st Hoping to complete application by August 1, 2023.

Small Local Park Grant - \$150,000 Maximum Grant amount (Population under 20,000) Non-Urban Park Grant - \$750,000 Maximum Grant Amount (Population up to 500,000)

Upgraded and User Friendly Website Software and Administrator

Currently still exploring a user friendly website software that BEDC can create, update and maintain.

I have interviewed 2 companies already and will be talking to the current website provider as the City of Bellville uses. Contract with respective fees will be forthcoming.

Working with the same company as the City of Bellville utilizes in regards to email security and upgrades. The monthly fee will be \$100.00 as long as BEDC pays 12 months at a time. If we sign a 3 year contract, all emails will be forwarded from our current provider, Business Network Solutions.
